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Prelude:





At the end of the try out, the post-test was administered of both the groups.



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Difference between Pre-Test and Post-Test to Investigate the Development of Listening Skills through WordsWorth English Language Lab




Figure shows the comparison between pre-test and post-test conducted on experimental group to investigate the effectiveness of software to develop listening skills. Students from computer department acted as experimental group where they appeared for pre-test, treatment was given to them and at the end appeared for post-test. In Figure 01 blue line indicates result of pre-test taken before the treatment and red line indicates the result of post-test conducted after the treatment.



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

In the above mentioned chart blue lines indicate the pre-test of experimental group and orange line shows the post-test of the experimental group. - 4. Technically, it is not accessible/ flexible in terms of the software support.
